Abstract

The paper must include an abstract which comprehensibly summarizes the main points of the paper. The abstract should be intelligible to an uninitiated reader and its length should be about 200 words. The abstract comes after the introductory information, which are the paper title, author's name and affiliation. The title is in capital letters, 14 point, bold, centred (style Title). The author's name is 12 point, bold, centred (style Author). The affiliation is 10 points, italic, centred (style Author information). The e-mail address is NOT a hypertext link. The abstract is aligned justified, 9 points, Times New Roman (style Abstract). Keywords (see below) are in the same style.

Keywords: conference, template, abstract.

Introduction

This template was created with the aim of keeping unified approach to paper typing for the biennial international scientific conference on *Nation and Language: Aspects of Socio-Linguistic Development* held in Panevėžys. The template contains predefined styles and the document text layout. The largest part of the paper is a chapter text typed in 11 points Times New Roman, aligned justified (style Normal).

Headings

All level headings are typed in bold, 12 points, centered, Times New Roman (style Heading1). There's a 12 points space before and 6 points space after the heading. DO NOT leave empty line before and after the headings.

Figures, tables and equations

Figures and tables should be placed as close as possible to where they are cited. Figures and tables should be numbered separately and consecutively.

Figure's captions are typed in 11 points, centered, Times New Roman (style Figure_caption). Example of the figure is given in Figure 1.

Table's captions are typed in 11 points, centered, Times New Roman. Text in the tables are typed in 10 points, Times New Roman. Example of the table is given in Table 1.

Make sure that your figures and tables are readable after PDF-transformation.

All equation numbers should be placed on separate lines and numbered consecutively. Equation numbers should be placed within parentheses (1).

Referring

The information sources are referenced in the text within parentheses, inside which the first author and publication year are stated e.g. (Brown, 2003).

References

The list of references has to be arranged alphabetically according to the first author, are typed in 10 points, Times New Roman, numbered (style References). Publications by the same author(s) should be listed in order of the year of the publication. Please note that all references listed here must be directly cited in the body of the text. The references should be formatted in APA style (www.apastyle.org). Here are some basic reference forms (*journal article*; *book*; *book chapter*):
